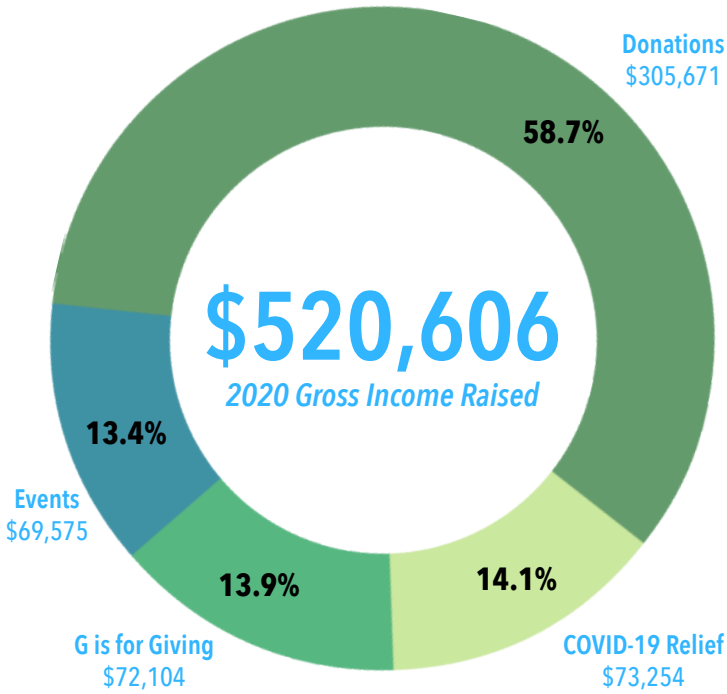

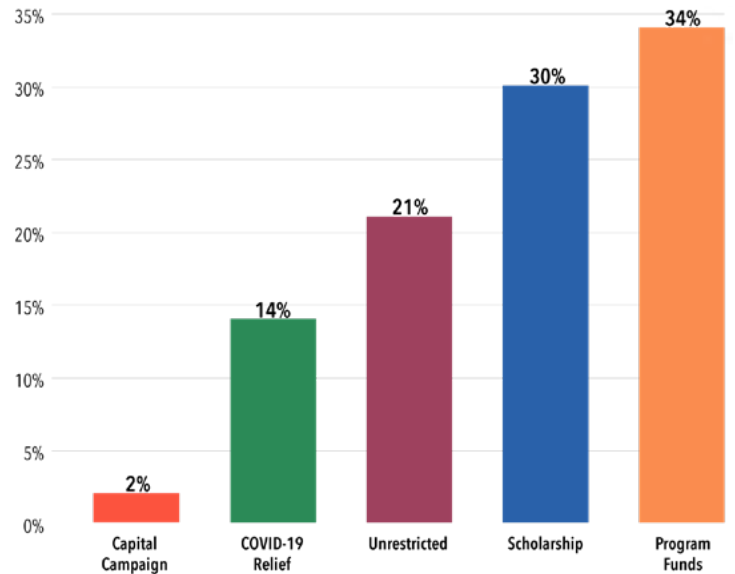

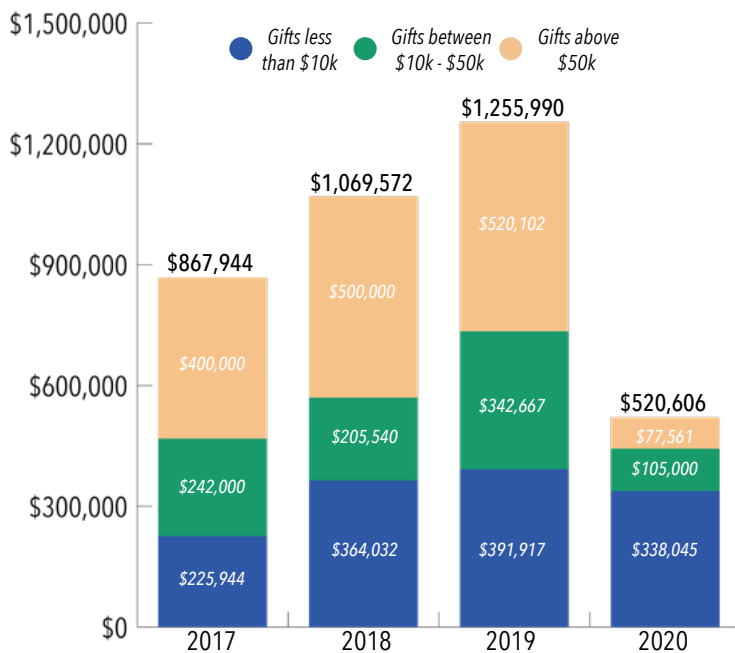


2020 Income % by Fund Type Designation

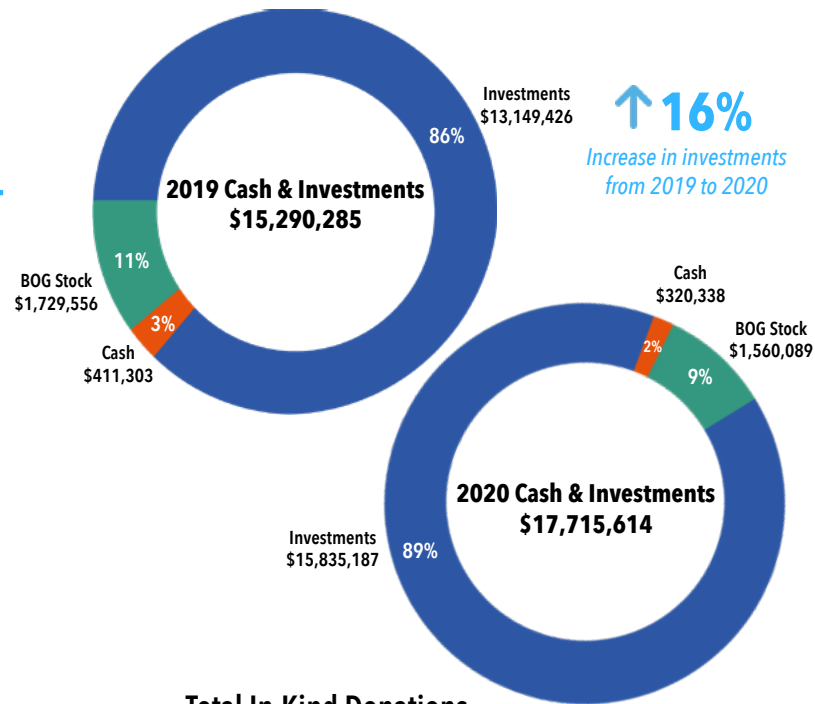


Our largest donation of 2020 was **\$77,561** from the Estate of the late Marjorie Driver to the General Endowment.

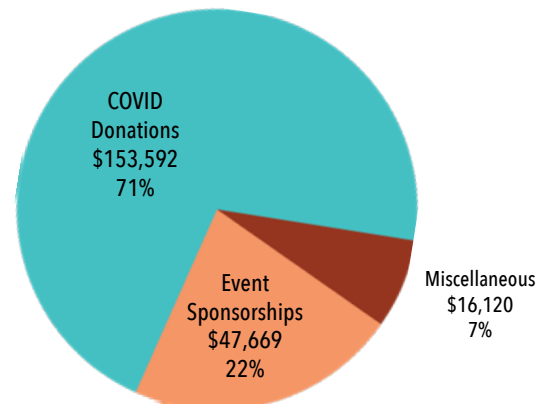
Gross Income Raised, 2017-2020 (Not including investment earnings)

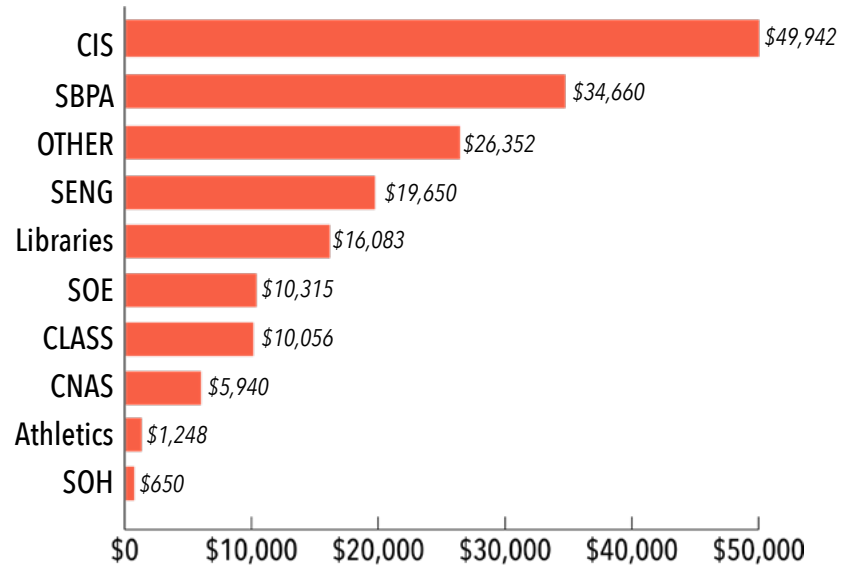

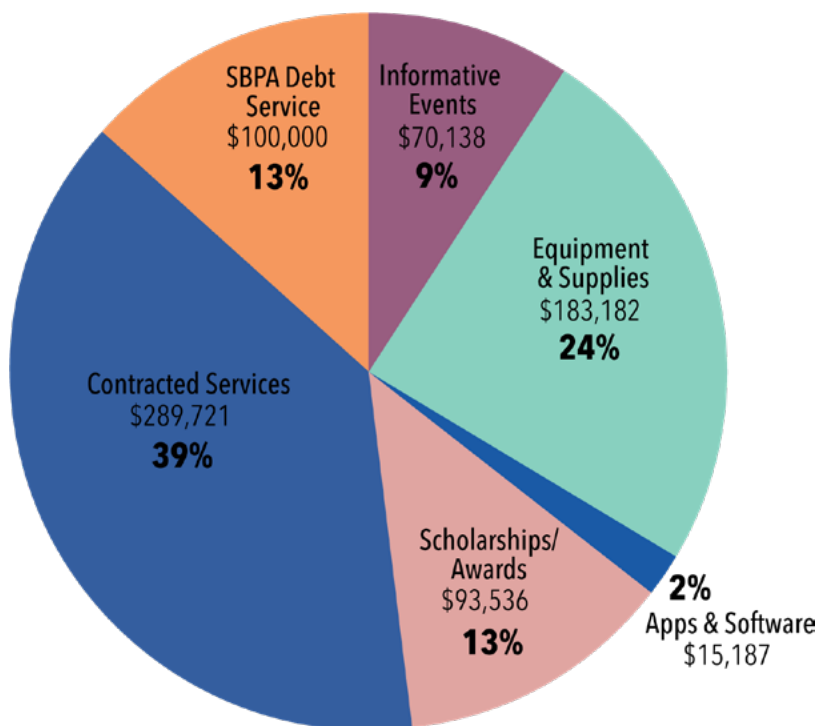

2020 IN REVIEW

Major Organizational Developments

To say 2020 was a challenging year would be an understatement. However, the Endowment Foundation also had significant triumphs this past year. The majority of the foundation's activities were hampered or downright canceled by the COVID-19 pandemic. Like the rest of the world, we needed to adapt to the "new normal." Our operations shifted to telework and when office presence was imperative we worked on a staggered schedule to mitigate close contact. We instituted temperature checks, mandated PPE's, and enforced strict social distancing protocols while on-site. Despite minor obstacles inherent with virtual operations, we conducted business as usual and continue to serve the needs of the University of Guam and our donors.

Many events slated for 2020 were canceled as a result of the pandemic. We were able to forge ahead by holding virtual events towards the end of the year. Notably, 'G is for Giving' & its events went virtual. Though we missed the face-to-face dynamic of 'G is for Giving', we still raised \$72,104 in individual donations for UOG programs, buildings, and student scholarships. It is a testament that even in hard times, people give to causes that move their hearts. We are grateful for the continued support especially in light of the great economic hardships imposed by the pandemic on our island and worldwide.

We must acknowledge and remember the human cost of the pandemic. As of this report, the island has documented 137 COVID-19 fatalities. In addition to COVID-related deaths, the island community lost some esteemed people: *the fifth President of the University of Guam*, Dr. Jose Q. Cruz, *Guam Cancer Center Emerita Director*, Christine P. Lewis, *UOG professor of the School of Education*, Dr. Suzanne U. Bells, *Catholic Social Services mentor*, Cerila Rapadas, *UOG Vice President of Instruction*, Dr. Roy Suda, *former Yona Mayor*, Ken Joe Ada, and longtime friends of the Endowment Foundation, Sylvia Blas Mendiola, Judith Salas, and Carmen San Agustin. Let us take a moment to pause and reflect on their passing and convey our well wishes to their loved ones.

Through the generosity of their loved ones, four new endowed scholarships were formed to honor their legacy. The Dr. Jose Quinene Cruz Education Scholarship, the Christine P. Lewis Memorial Fund, the Cerila Rapadas Scholarship, and the Sylvia Blas Mendiola Scholarship for Mothers were established in 2020.



We are happy to announce our recent listing as an AmazonSmiles Charitable Organization. The AmazonSmiles program is a philanthropic initiative; if you purchase eligible items on Amazon, they will donate 0.5% of that sale to the UOG Endowment Foundation. Our acceptance into the program is the culmination of years of hard work by our team. This is a great way for donors to engage with the Endowment Foundation as well as a new sustainable revenue source to help us fulfill our mission on behalf of the university.

G is for Giving & Giving Tuesday

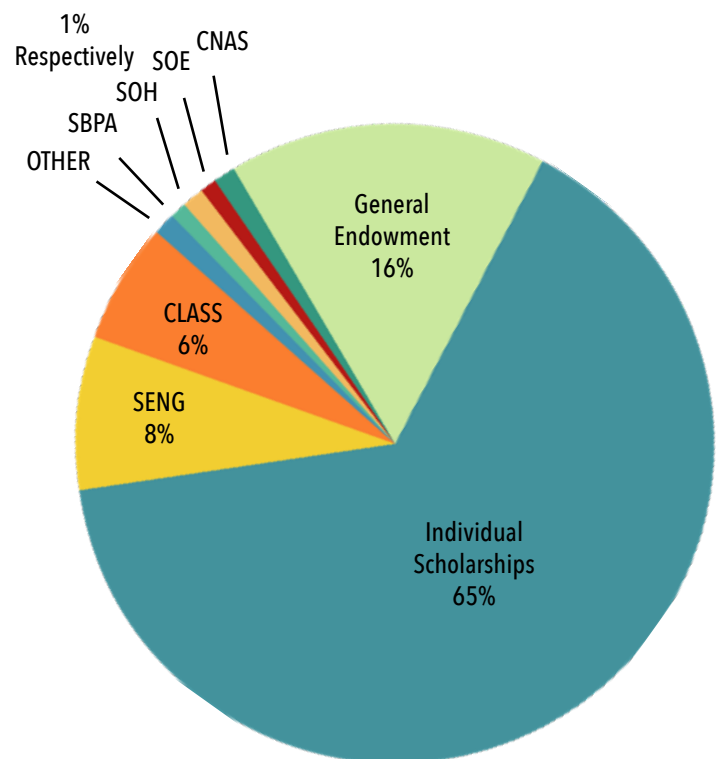
2020 marked the fourth annual 'G is for Giving' campaign and this year we went virtual! Giving Tuesday activities and G is for Giving activities were held virtually thanks to the magic of ZOOM. While we were not able to match previous years' giving amounts, we are ecstatic at the abundance of love and support despite the economic hardships during the pandemic. We raised \$72,104 in individual donations over the Giving season, \$2,000 in events, and \$800 on Giving Tuesday alone.

Giving Tuesday (December 1, 2020) was the official launch of G is for Giving and the campaign runs through the end of the year. This year, we welcomed back notable UOG Alumna Chelsea Ting San Nicolas as our honorary co-chairwoman. We also had the privilege of welcoming Amy Jackson, a UOG Alumna and Navy Veteran, to be our honorary co-chairwoman. We are thankful for all of their efforts to raise awareness for G is for Giving. Their leadership was instrumental in helping us navigate the daunting task of raising scholarship funds in the midst of the pandemic.

On Giving Tuesday, we held a series of virtual activities throughout the day. We greeted the day with a YOGA session with the School of Health, we had a children's book reading session with Dean Alicia Aguon of the School of Education, we had an indigenous film discussion panel with the College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences, as well as a virtual Power Lunch/information session with the Jesus and Maria Eugenia Leon Guerrero School of Business & Public Administration. We held a virtual trivia night fundraiser to support the Student Government Association's Book Scholarship.

Our final G is for Giving event was a Virtual Paint & Sip featuring TAOPacific Designs', Joseph Certeza. Guests received a curated artbox with everything they needed to channel their inner DaVinci.

Thank you for making G is for Giving a success. It is heartwarming to know that even in the most uncertain times, our island familia will band together to support UOG students. All funds raised go directly to support student scholarships & programs.



SCHOLARSHIPS

Over the past year, the UOG Endowment Foundation awarded 44 individual scholarships to UOG students for a total disbursement of \$74,900.

We also had the privilege to work with some very generous community members who are committed to advancing our island community through the students at UOG. Together, we worked to form 7 new scholarships to give students even more opportunities to ease some of the financial burdens associated with the cost of school.

Kurt S. Moylan Foundation Scholarship

The Kurt S. Moylan Foundation Scholarship was established to honor the legacy of prolific entrepreneur and visionary Kurt S. Moylan. The KSM Foundation Scholarships aim to cultivate Guam's future business leaders. The scholarships are open to Business Administration majors who can demonstrate their vision for a better Guam through a 500-word essay.



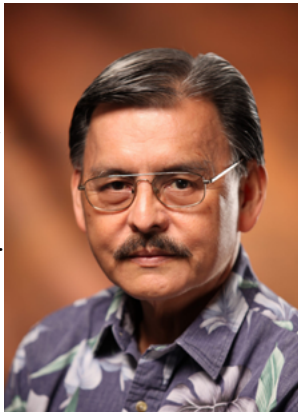
Sylvia Blas Mendiola Scholarship for Mothers

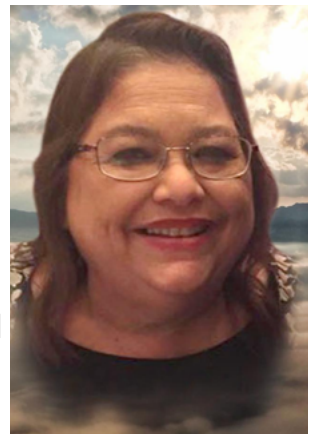
Christine P. Lewis Memorial Fund

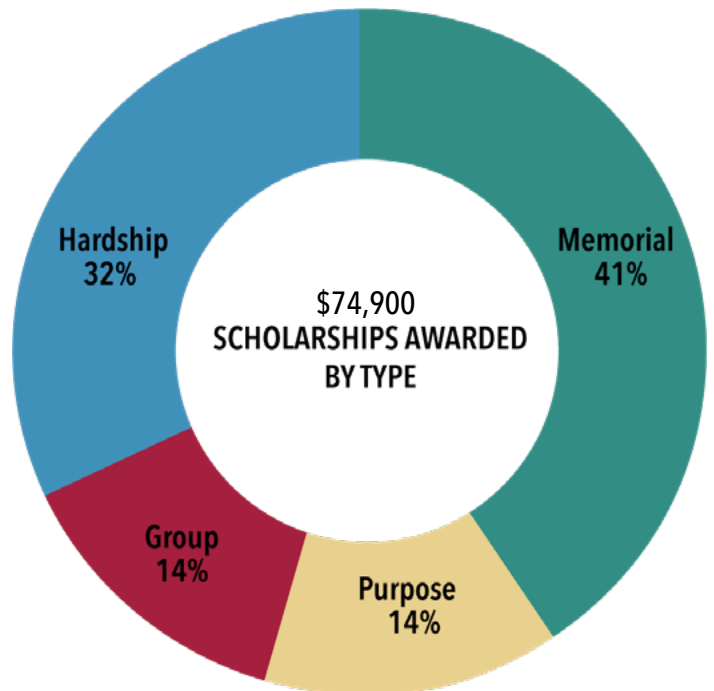

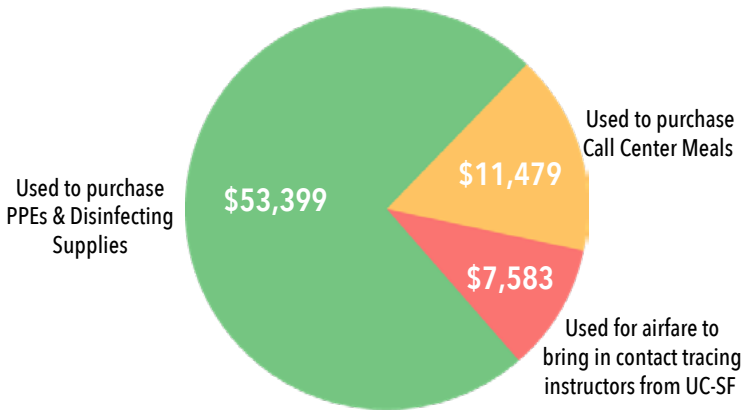
Though most of our in-person events for 2020 were canceled due to the pandemic, we continued to pursue the Foundation's mission to support the University of Guam in new and creative ways.

UOG Live Stream Telethon: Tritons for Covid-19 Relief

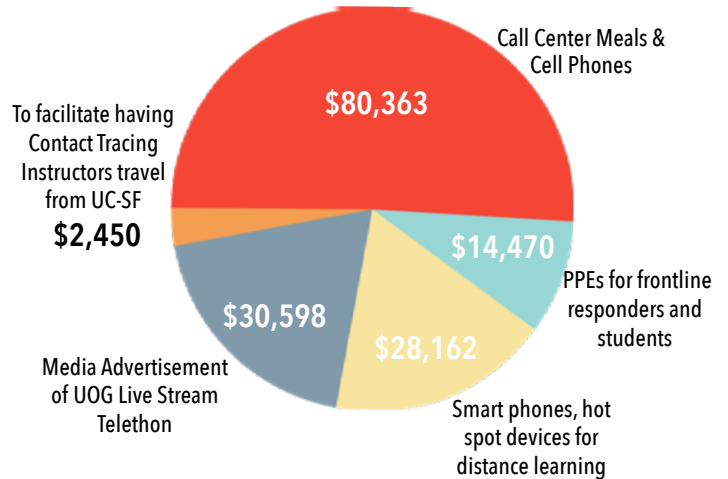

SBPA Mixer

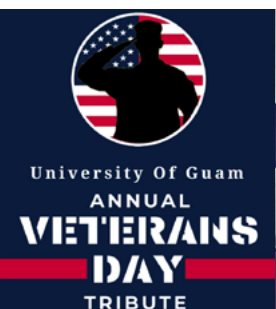

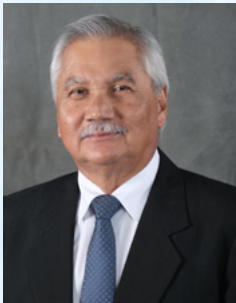
